

If you're interested in becoming a Patient Care Technician (PCT), this training could be a good option.

1. Organization providing the training:

3. Description of the training offered:

Trainees have the opportunity to advance their skills as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) and become a Patient Care Technician (PCT). This 14-week training prepares CNAs to perform delegated nursing functions that require a higher level of technical ability and skill needed in the hospital setting. In the training, trainees will review the basic skills learned in CNA courses and learn new advanced CNA skills including wound care, EKG, and venipuncture. This training meets during the evenings twice per week for 4 hours (T, R 5:30-9:45pm). As a prerequisite to this training, participants are required to complete the Mental Health First Aid training offered in conjunction with the PCT training.

- Mental Health First Aid
- Patient Care Technician

5. Am I eligible?

To be eligible for this training program, applicants must:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be a Maryland resident
- Have a High School Diploma or GED®
- Have a sincere desire to work within the healthcare industry
- Be committed to completing all requirements of the program
- Be willing and able to obtain employment upon training completion

- Be a CNA/GNA in good standing with the Maryland Board of Nursing
- Have the following certifications- American Heart Association (AHA), Basic Life Support (BLS), and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)
- Be up to date on immunizations
- Complete a criminal background check as well as a drug screening

6. What is the application process?

7. How much can I expect to earn if I complete this program and obtain employment as a Certified Patient Care Technician (PCT)?

Trainees who complete this program and obtain employment as a Patient Care Technician can expect to earn an average wage of \$15.82 per hour.
