

Profile of Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) Recipients



Most have recent work experience, but their earnings are low

- ❖ 55% worked in the year before receiving TCA
- Earned a median of \$4,319 in that year
- ❖ 68% worked in the year after leaving TCA
- Earned a median of \$6,412 in that year

They do not receive welfare for long periods of time


59% received assistance for 2 years or less in last 10 years

9% received assistance for more than 5 of the last 10 years

Typically, they are African American women with 1 or 2 children

- ❖ 96% are female.
- * 68% are African American
- * 31 years old, on average
- * 68% have 1 to 2 children
- ❖ 50% have a child under 3 years old

Some have disabilities that are expected to last over 1 year
