- ❖ 55% worked in the year before receiving TCA
- Earned a median of \$6,281 in that year
- ❖ 63% worked in the year after leaving TCA


They do not receive welfare for long periods of time

66% received assistance for 2 years or less in last 10 years 12% received assistance for more than 5 of the last 10 years

Typically, they are African American women with 1 or 2 young children

- ❖ 90% are female
- ❖ 57% are African American
- ❖ 34 years old, on average
- * 71% have 1 to 2 children
- ❖ 40% have a child under 3 years old

Some have disabilities that are expected to last over 1 year
