Many have recent work experience, but their earnings are low

- ❖ 52% worked in the year before receiving TCA
- Earned a median of \$3,860 in that year
- ❖ 52% worked in the year after leaving TCA
- Earned a median of \$6,824 in that year

They do not receive welfare for long periods of time


73% received assistance for 2 years or less in last 10 years

6% received assistance for more than 5 of the last 10 years

Typically, they are Caucasian women with 1 or 2 young children

- ♦ 85% are female.
- ❖ 75% are Caucasian
- * 32 years old, on average
- ❖ 71% have 1 to 2 children
- ❖ 48% have a child under 3 years old

Some have disabilities that are expected to last over 1 year
